2018 is over with, somehow. It felt like it would never end, and yet here I am again, short for time, doing last-minute work, as I do so often. This Patreon has seen some excellent growth this year, and while 2017 was pretty hard to top, I think 2018 did manage it, in its own way.

If you weren't here last year for the inaugural report, here's the deal: I release these annual reports of my income, spending, and past/future goals, to give you an idea of what your support means to me. It's also a measure of transparency, so if you are interested in doing this for your own career, you can have some idea how it works.

2018 was a hugely successful year for me, probably the most important one I've had so far. This Patreon increased, of course, but I also moved across the country (again), published two independent comic books, met some incredible people, and did an honest-to-god celebrity appearance at the world's largest furry convention. It's been... a big one, in so many words.

El Indon returns in 2019!

It will follow the issue-to-issue design that worked so well for Ask The Werewolves. Each chapter will be a single enclosed issue. Making this and ATW at the same time, I hope to finish one issue of comics every month or so. This would mean one month of working on ATW, one month of El Indon, trading off, and occasionally making time for issues of other, standalone stories.

In practice, this pace is very hard to keep up - it almost necessitates finishing one page every day, and issues not longer than 24 pages or so. For this reason, it'll probably end up being more like ten comic books produced in one year, and about five of those will be chapters of El Indon.

Now you might ask: JD, I'm glad you're doing this again, but why now? Wasn't this a goal for reaching the \$2,500/month level, and you're not there yet? Well... it's a lot of intersecting reasons.

The first, foremost one is that I'm tired of this not happening. It's my story, and I want it finished before I die, numbers be damned. The second reason is that El Indon is a decidedly non-horny piece of art, something that ATW and my commissions don't qualify as, and that censors will have a harder time cracking down on.

And the third reason is... I don't want to do commissions anymore.


Instead of a monthly queue of commissions, I want to do monthly comic issues.

Don't get me wrong, I love doing commissions for all of you. It's such a great feeling to turn what you imagine into a real piece of art, and marvel at how happy it makes you. But after three years of doing it, I have to conclude that it does get repetitive. Furries are great, but furry commissions all tend to put me in the same mindset, and it's not a terribly good thing for my creativity. I find I'm only drawing what I'm told to, never being challenged, getting complacent and sloppy. Besides, commission income is limited to what a small clientele can pay, and it's not very good pay for the time invested - but it's not so with comic issues.

Making comic issues, I earn more money for about the same amount of work, and it's a work I entirely control. It's the work I wanted to do all along, these past three years. I'm so grateful you helped me get to this point, where it's not just a far-off goal on next year's calendar anymore. It *can* be done.

If you still want a commission from me, don't worry, they won't go away completely. They'll just be much less common. I also want to try some more YCH and auction pieces in the future, since the Mistletoe Matchup one came out very nicely. Speaking of that...





FUTURE PROJECTS What else is brewing on the horizon?

For most of this past year, I pondered the idea of creating an LLC for my business, and I want to make that a goal, if not for this year, then the next.

Unfortunately, California is an extremely strict state to do that in. As much as I'd want to try it, it looks like my income is still too low. Incorporating costs fees and demands insurance, and in California, it would mean another \$800 a year in taxes, at least. I don't think I can pay that, especially not after my debacle with the IRS that you all had to help me with. This year, I'll probably just get new forms of insurance and stay the course until my business grows larger.

And as for staying the course: the ongoing crackdown on adult content means that, just like last year, Patreon and Stripe might crap out on us at any time. I worry that Itchio might do the same, if pressured. If these things come to pass, I plan to switch to a mailing-list-style business model, and I may need to change web hosts as well. But those are bridges that we only need to cross if we come to them.

I may have mentioned [Secret Project #1] before.



I hesitate to even tell you about this, because I don't know exactly what it'll end up being. At the moment it's more of an atmospheric vibe than a solid idea. But as time passes, who knows? This might turn into something big. I'll say this much: this is the only project I have on the table right now that *doesn't* involve furries.

And that, with some deep breaths, was 2018.

It felt like a decade, as so many of us have said. Like last year, there's new and terrible legislation appearing almost every day, some of it being shot down, some of it not. Horrible things keep happening in my corner of the world and yours, and at times, it feels like nothing will ever get fixed. But, I suppose, that's no different from any other year.

When I started this job three years ago, I had the self-hateful rejection that I would never go to a furry convention. After I went to my first con, I had the fleeting idea that I might one day be confident enough to give a panel talk. Never, not ever, did I expect that I'd be a Guest Of Honor at the world's largest furry convention. The thing to marvel about is, **you** are the ones who made it happen, not me. This the only culture, the only work, that has given me validation and respect for what I enjoy, and what I'm good at. These past three years have been the happiest of my life.

Hopefully, you and I can make 2019 another good one.
