# MANUAL Report

2019 is over and done with, finally, and forgive me for being so blunt, but this was one of the worst years I've ever had. While 2018 was rocky, if largely successful, 2019 was roadblock after failure after roadblock.

For those just joining us recently: I release these annual reports of my income, spending, and past/future goals, to give you an idea of what your support means to me. It's also how I keep transparency between my Patrons and myself, so you can have an idea how my business works. And this year, things *kinda didn't work*.

2019 was the first year my Patreon income dropped significantly. I had to move across the country again, involuntarily this time, then move house again when that arrangement didn't work out either. I am far from the place I wanted to be at the start of the year (in many different ways), mostly due to all the interruptions, the missteps, the burnout, and a general lack of resources and time.

So, let's take this mess apart and find out why.

Puring all of this I was also very depressed, so I ate at far too many restaurants. Also, the kitchen at my CA apartment was never, ever clean, which made cooking for myself that much harder. Those of you who follow my cooking escapades on Twitter know that I've started to correct that weakness of mine.

Not paying \$1100 every month was a huge improvement in income, but things didn't last.

Most of you will remember that I had to cut the \$30 tier from my Patreon, since I don't have the time or energy to offer sketches anymore. This resulted in a loss of about \$400-450 a month, until I can open a tier like that again, if ever.

At the end of July my dad lost his job, and we had to move *again*, this time to a much cheaper, much worse living situation that's frankly too loaded and too depressing to mention here.

A few upsides are that the Skunktember auction did very well, and FoxMeGently was released to warm reception and pretty good sales (not represented on this chart, since the year is not over yet).


October and November were improvements, with sales coming in for the ATW dakimakura and my current gig with the Fandom documentary.



## COMING YEAR What's the plan for 2020?

Unlike previous years, when I listed a set of projects I'd like to do, or milestones I'd like to reach, this year I'd like to keep it simple:

#### My objective in 2020 is to finish Ask The Werewolves.

I've outlined a complete story arc for myself to follow, that will take us to, I think, Issue #9 or #10. This means doing about 6 or 7 issues in a single year, far more achievable than the previous target of 1 per month.

After finishing this arc, I would put ATW aside for... not forever, but a while. It would be in a state I could call "complete," but still open to returning in the future. It's been a wonderful 4 years, going on 5, but I would like this project to have some kind of finish line, so I could work on others.



This plan does mean a few things:

One, yes, El Indon is on hiatus for another year. I know, I'm tired of waiting too.

**Two**, except for Patreon rewards and commission openings, anything I'd like to make that's **not** ATW is low-priority. There would also be blog posts mixed in with the issues, but don't expect a second *FoxMeGently* or any other big comic project this year. It **might** happen, but I doubt it.

## FUTURE PROJECTS What else is in the works?

Despite that previous plan excluding much else, there are a few future projects in the works this year. Chiefly, I'm planning to open an online store to sell dakis, pins, stickers, and all kinds of other stuff - maybe even bound comics!





This is proving to be a lot of work, but you can probably expect it to open by the end of Q1 2020.



And that's 2019, one of the worst years I can remember having. But it's done.

I'd like to thank you all again for your dearly needed support. You've been here for me in good times and bad times, and these were pretty bad, so you're all the more appreciated. The world seems to get a little uglier, then a little brighter, then a little uglier as we go along, like we're fighting to clean a window.
