The book will start in June with no interruption of the numbering. It will start off bi-monthly so I can build a backlog of stories. Once I feel I'm far enough ahead then I'll accelerate to a monthly status again.

I want to thank everyone for being so patient with the series and hope that its return to AP will signal a new beginning. I think the fun has just begun.



Congratulations to Jerry Collins, again a father! This time a son. Best wishes to the Collins household!


























FINAL EMBRACE: Admira Ismic, a Muslim, crawled to Serbian boyfriend Bosko Brckic, wrapped an arm around him, and died.

### Romeo and Juliet, Serb and Muslim

A Muslim woman and her Serbian boyfriend died together as they sprinted for freedom from Sarajevo, the Serb-besieged capital of Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Now, six days later, the same sniper fire that ended their lives keeps them locked in an embrace of death. Mortally wounded, Admira Ismic crawled to the body of Bosko Brckic, wrapped an arm around him, and died.

The two, both 25, died Wednesday after running across Sarajevo's Vrbanja Bridge between Bosnian Serb and Muslim-led government forces as they tried to flee the fighting.

"The sniper fired so fast they didn't

even have a chance to take cover," said Djenan Prijanica, a special forces police trooper who witnessed the killing.

Almost a week later, the couple is still

locked in their fatal embrace.

Bosnian government troops tried to cross the bridge to retrieve the bodies or at least burn them.

"They had to turn back because of sniper fire," said Nedzad Alajbegovic, a police sniper on the government side.

"The Serbs can't retrieve them either, because our snipers would get them,' Alajbegovic said.

Lots of anthropomorphica from you lately but I haven't written since October; I don't know if you're interested, but here's one fan's view of recent publications.

Furrlough #11- an all military issue, hence less to my tastes than others. Funny cover. Page 1- you misspelled Toivo Rovainen's name. There, that's the spelling comment out of the way. (Actually, spelling in this batch seems much improved. Bravo.)

My favorite pieces were "Under Realm" (despite clumsy synopsizing on page 1) and Jim Groat's piece.

I seem to have missed Furrlough #12 somehow, but here's #13. Hm, it says #11 on page 1; maybe I should average that with the cover and it's really #12 after all. Anyway. Drawing's a bit sketchy this issue, except for the Rovainen groaner. "Watering Hole" is an interesting story, "Bat Lancers" eh, "Sex Kitten" is just as funny and charming as the previous reprint. And sillier. Only in comics is it simpler to fly around the world at near- light speed than to fly to a different city to get laid.

Genus #3- after two relatively sedate issues-explicit sex at times, but I don't think there was a single crotch shot-I was surprised to see those gross DeJesus sketches in #3. If that isn't the "blatant pornography" of rule 11, I don't know what is. Didn't like them- not only are they crude in execution and theme, the woman doesn't seem to be enjoying herself. Come to think of it, even in the rest of #3 the only visible genitalia was in the teaser for #4. Anyway, the stories would be good in any anthropomorphic comic, which means they're extraordinarily good for a sex comic. All well drawn, all funny. In the Lois/Kent story I particularly liked Nikki's reaction to being felt up, "perhaps you've had a wee too much to drink", "Bad dog! Bad!", "Republican!". I dislike bondage but "Shopping Trip" was otherwise okay. And "Son of a Beach" shows Todd Sutherland writing as well as ever and Charles Davies drawing better than ever. And though I don't care much for pinups, I got a kick out of the two Shon/Collins mice; my, but they're intertwined. The only thing I regret a little is that there's no "Mink" this issue.

Katmandu#1-2: Terrie Smith is one of my favorite anthropomorphic artists; she does an excellent and sexy job on a decent story. The backups are enjoyable too. With two writers and two artists, and pinups by others, the Katmandu world would seem to be an ongoing project; I trust we'll be seeing more after this miniseries?

Shanda the Panda#1-3: I don't have the time to do this justice, so I'll just say that the writing is consistently good but is not helped by playing musical artists; Pat Dolan's cartoony style is particularly unsuited to it. Michele Light does a good job but Joe Rosales would be wonderful.

Strangers in Paradise#1: The only non-anthropomorphic zine I get from Antarctic (assuming Gold Digger doesn't count). Very

issue, I thought. The beatnik plot in "Buffalo Wings" was silly, which might be okay in a cartoonier series but is less suited to a semirealistic one like this.

"Vixy Vid" was my favorite piece; how true. "The Last Bus Station of Elvis" is okay, though I enjoyed the tidbits (Firesign Theater reference, cameos by Jimmy Chin and Sarah) more than the story itself. "Shanda" was too sentimental for me, though I certainly agree that Deal Whitley's death was a tragic loss.



Alright, time to bitch a little. As a dedicated vulpophile I have only one major problem with your Vixens, their tails> A perfect example is the Vixen sitting on the bike on page 6. Her tail is way too small, it should be as long as her leg. The Vixens on the "equipment specs page have better tails but they should be longer and less bushy. I base this comparison on the hottest vixen of all time: Vicky Wyman's Fatima. Vicky's two drawings of Fatima in Xanadu#1 on page 26 and 27, is the definitive anthropomorphic Vixen. Fatima's tail is to scale with her body, slightly longer than her legs. This looks "right" to me and I think your Vixens could benefit from better tails.

Another characteristic about Fatima I like is that she doesn't have any head-hair. This is the "purist" anthropomorphic view and I'd like to see one of your Vixens without any head-hair, (Gedda doesn't really count). But don't worry about digitigrade legs though, I know how hard they are to draw. The art otherwise is definitely pulse-quickening and I hope that you can go to color like Albedo. Half the fun of anthropomorphic Red Fox Vixens is the great contrasts of their white and red fur. The writing is great too, but with the Tank Vixens around I ain't really lookin' at the word bubbles. That's what is so great about your comic, you know this and tailor your comic appropriately. So keep up the fantastic work and I look forward to getting the next issue of Tank Vixens.


