Good cover by Mike Dashow.

"Stosstrupp" is back!! And this raccoon couldn't be happier. "Stosstrupp" has always been my favorite serial in Furlough. The art is much better than in the past, IMHO, with more shading. The writing is quite good, with a little more depth of character on the Eurasian side of the war in this issue, and the lettering is now much clearer. A definite tip of the hat to Mr. Sheppard.

"Collars & Cuffs" by Lane & Clark was well done, although the bits at the end were a trifle confusing. Maybe I missed something along the way. "Target Practice" by Fits & Seneres was probably the most emotionally wrenching story I've read for a while. Well drawn, too. Brought a tear to my eye.

"The Sound & the Furry" by Oppen & Wilcken continued. I'm not a fan of this serial. I never read the original story it's based on, and I don't like the art. Could be just me, though.

There are also two ads for Stinz to be appearing in **Wild Life** in the future (the two ads seem identical- didn't understand that myself) and a letters page.

Overall, a much-better-than-average issue of **Furrlough**. A must-have.

#16 "Live By the Bullet, Die By the Blade". Flawless execution, if not a little dark. I can't place the style, but this is definitely a work of art, well worth the time it must have taken to do. Great work. Scott

"Watering Hole". Pat, let me tell you that I am an ardent fan of yours, and I love your simple but extremely effective style. I've been religiously following "Watering Hole" since its appearance in Furrlough #13. I saw the notice at the bottom of page...page.... Wait a second, where are the page numbers? (And to think I fork out \$2.75 for this.) Anyway, it apologized for the poor quality of "installment two". This is odd because it's Part 3 that suffered the poor quality. It hurt me to see Grotch like that at the bottom of page, er, of the eighth page (that's the next to last page). Otherwise, the story's great, sort of a cross between "Total Recall". "Robotech", and "Pogo" (only a cigar-smoking alligator's been replaced

by a cigarette-smoking kangaroo with an alligator for a business associate; oh, well, must be a Kelley thing). Keep up the good work.
"Coven A' My House". "Sex Kitten" is enjoyable, as usual. The only thing I noticed this time, though, is that I had trouble differentiating Sex Kitten from the cat witch in

the second panel. I guess this is the problem of using iconic characters. (The same thing forced you to make all the coven members different species, too, whether you realized it or not.) Then again, since "Sex Kitten" is so iconic, it's easier to identify with it, giving it that familiarity aspect which makes it so popular-it appeals to everybody. Most unusual.

#15: The only thing I'll mention here is "Target Practice", by Bill Fitts and Dan Seneres. I sort of lost faith in Mr. Fitts after

"Bomb Kitty", which ran in Furrlough #12. (Wait a second, I see Mr. Seneres' signature here too. Wonder why he wasn't given credit in the table of contents.) I guess it's just the difference of writing a strip off of a joke and writing one off of a news article. I was very impressed with "Target Practice". Pretty good, pretty good.

Before I go, I would like to comment on Paul Kidd and Mike Sagara's latest endeavor, **Tank Vixens**. This is an exceptional comic book, and no true vulpophile should be without a copy. Mr. Sproul approved of Mike's renderings of the 101'st Heavy Tank Crushing Battalion well enough, as did I. It's evident throughout the book that Mike loves his job, and it shows in his art.

Let me go through it, page by desensitizing page:

Page 1: I sometimes wonder why comic series always start with a picture of the planet from space. Perry's "UnderRealm", Flahive's Space Wolf, and even Spawn did this. Page 7: "Oh, it's okay as long as you use a little Vaseline." Now, that's a quote! Page 13: This was the weakest joke in the whole book. I was sort of expecting it. Pages 16-17: Excellent. Page 26: Nice. (Help, I'm being desensitized.) Page 29: Surprisingly, this is the worst page. Mike, this wasn't necessary. Really good art turns me on more than this ever could, and the rest of the book exhibited had it. The disclaimer at the bottom of the page was funny, I'll give you that. (So, I loved Tank Vixens. No, I hated it. No. it's both.)

Anyway, as I said, if you still don't have **Tank Vixens**, I recommend you pick up a copy. I'm looking forward to #2.





Guidelines for Submissions

FURRLOUGH · WILD LIFE · Genus

- 1. We are now accepting submissions for three anthologies.
 - Furrlough- monthly action- adventure anthology (not limited to military.)
 Rating is G to PG-13
 - Wild Life bi-monthly general-theme anthology geared towards humor and slice-of- life stories. Rating is G to soft R.
 - •Genus bi-monthly anthology of material of a more adult nature (sort of a turbo charged Wild Life.) Rating is R to X.
- 2. Minimum length of submissions is one page. Maximum length is 12 pages. For serialized stories, we prefer chapters to be six to eight pages in length.
- When presenting all story ideas, please submit pencilled samples, story guidelines and /or scripts for editorial comment. We may need to request revisions or changes and this will make both our jobs easier.
- 4. Single page illustrations and cover illustrations are and cover illustrations are invited For covers, please submit a concept sketch or xerox of pencils for editorial comment. We can handle color work if you do not wish to.
- 5. No stories containing ring-tailed lemurs will be accepted for Furrlough **no exceptions** (even scantily-clad ones!)
- Copyrights of characters and stories will be held by their rightful creators. All artwork will be returned after publication. We are not responsible for any material lost or damaged by mail carriers.
- 7. Original art (or stats) should be in by the deadline date. This is not a set rule, but it makes our job easier.



- 9. We have the right to make editorial revisions to submitted stories.
 - For series, extra pages of character profiles, situations or historical data, and technical data are encouraged.
 - 11. We will not censor work, but we will not accept blatant pornography. There is no exceptions to this rule. (some sex and/or nudity violence will be acceptable if we feel it advances the story.)
- 12. Name and address **must** be included on the back of **each** page.
