CONTROVERSIAL: One of today's hottest topics, if we are to believe the press that's being given it in our industry, is the subject of comic book violence, comic book sex, and comic book suitability for children. Letters have appeared in trade papers claiming that we are "supposed" to be afraid of an "imminent crackdown" on comics, fostered by the Meese Commission of the 700 Club or some other quasi-official arbiter of taste.

Fans are in a ferment, comics creators are crying about the coming of censorship, retailers are predicting police raids, distributors are demanding blander books while re-ordering heavily on the ones they deplore as "excessively graphic," and publishers don't know whether to run and hide or buy a new wardrobe to wear to that congressional hearing they've been told to expect.

I myself have received a lot of phone calls, asking what i'm going to do about the "censorship crisis" and "the coming witch hunt."

Well, like the man said, all I know is what little i read in the papers. And what i read in the papers, folks, is all about illegal Iranian-Israeli arms deals, Nicaraguan and Afghan Swiss bank accounts, "a national hero" being fired and taking the Fifth, the head of the C.I.A. having seizures, Pentagon graft scandals, the Secretary of State admitting that one of his own ambassadors went behind his back to perform unlawful acts, the President being called a liar by his own ex-employees, and a special prosecutor being called in to see whose offenses are indictable and who will get immunity for ratting on whom.

I doubt that Mr. Meese, the man who is supposed to be about to launch a full-scale attack on comic books, has time to worry about our little four-colour world right now. I imagine he is up to his ankles in something stinky, and shoveling as fast as he can to avoid sinking in it.

In fact, i would say that a good part of the old "war on drugs" and "war on pornography" campaigns were a bread-and-circuses attempt to keep the public entertained while millions of their bucks were being siphoned off to high-bid military suppliers, illicit arms dealers, and fake "minority-owned" cartels like the one Mr. Meese himself owned a large block of stock

Yes, yes, yes, there are a lot of dustkittens under those fancy Washington beds, and i suspect that while they are being swept out into the light of day, nobody is gonna come knocking on my door and ask me to testify about how my comic books are corrupting the youth of this fair nation. I mean, if the Congress gets a chance to impeach the President, they won't waste time on a poor small fish like me!

Actually, nobody is after any of us, and, aside from the usual, occasional "parental outrage" story on some local television show, nothing at all is happening to lead me to believe that comics are due for any special form of attack. I can listen to the Larry King radio show any night of the week and hear a dozen callers rave about how "the Jews" are responsible for every evil act in the history of the world, but i never hear anyone blame comic books for destroying the morality of the nation. If this supposed "witch hunt" were really happening, we'd be hearing about it on radio talk shows, believe me. That's where the pulse of the nation beats, and right now it's beating hot and heavy about illegal arms deals and the Super Bowl. Comic books aren't even on the agenda.

But still we have this industry paranoia, and still we have long, worried editorials on the subject of "censoring ourselves before someone imposes censorship upon us."

Has it ever occurred to you that there might be people in our own industry who want to see censorship imposed and who have decided to "cry wolf" to frighten us into bowing to their desires?

I am reminded of a great, a classic poem which contains these lines:

Phone's tapped, anyway Maggie says that many say they must bust in early May, orders from the D.A.

And in these supposedly troubled, but not so hard times, i take comfort from the moral conclusion drawn in that same poem. You remember the words, don't you? That's right ...

#### Don't follow leaders Watch your parking meters!

Yes, people, if everyone only watched their own parking meters, instead of trying to watch the other guy's for him, there'd be a lot less dead soldiers in far away countries, and a lot more happiness right here at






