


































## **True Penguin Facts**

The penguins portrayed in Samurai Penguin™ are Emperor Penguins. The Emperor is the largest species of penguin, belonging to the genus Aptenodyres ("Featherless Diver"). They measure on the average of 4 feet from tail to beak and can weigh as much as 90 pounds.

The Emperor is the only Antarctic bird that breeds in winter. Confined to the Antarctic shelf during its breeding cycle, the Emperor lays its single egg in the dead of winter. Since there isn't much other than ice and snow at this time of year, the Emperor doesn't build nests. Instead, they incubate their eggs on the tops of their fleshy feet. Because of this bizarre breeding cycle, winter is the Emperor's biggest predator. Unstable ice conditions can keep parents from feeding their chicks. There are even years when whole generations do not survive. This may happen when the sea ice breaks loose from the ice shelf promontory, and the young are carried to their doom.

Among the other Emperor predators is a large bird known as the Giant Fulmar. This bird, sporting a seven foot wing span, may kill many penguin chicks and some adults. As much as one-third of the Emperors' deaths are due to the Giant Fulmar.

Killer Whales, sharks, and Leopard Seals also prey on Emperor Penguins. But, the Emperors' large size can discourage most of their predators.

The Emperor is the only bird that can live its entire life without ever touching land, living most of its life on the ice or in the water. It feeds mostly on fish, squid, and a tiny shrimp-like creature called krill.

At times throughout the run of Samurai Penguin™ I will pull out my artistic license. Settings will differ from what they are in nature; predators will do some unnatural things. Things will not always appear in the book as they do in nature. But, whenever I do stretch reality too much, I will try to point it out in the letters column.
