Thanks, too, to all our readers for their continuing support; we'll meet again someday! —ED.]

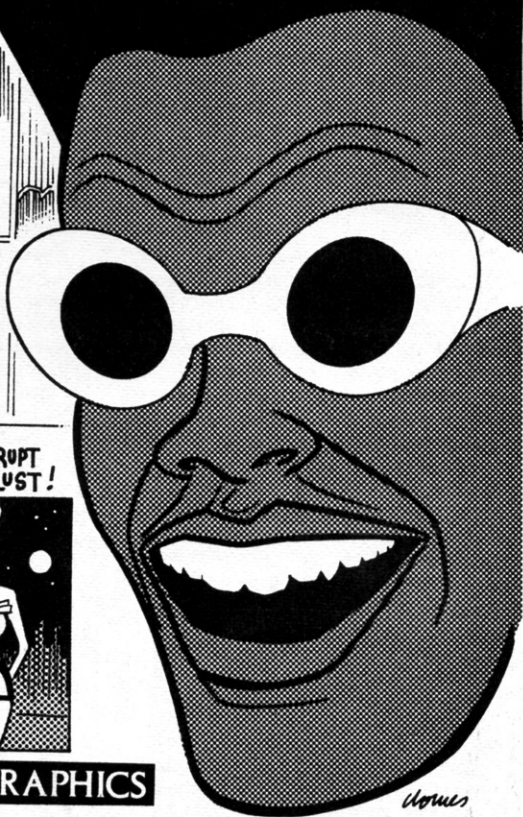

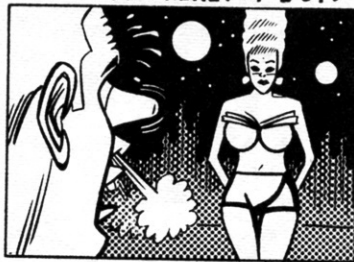

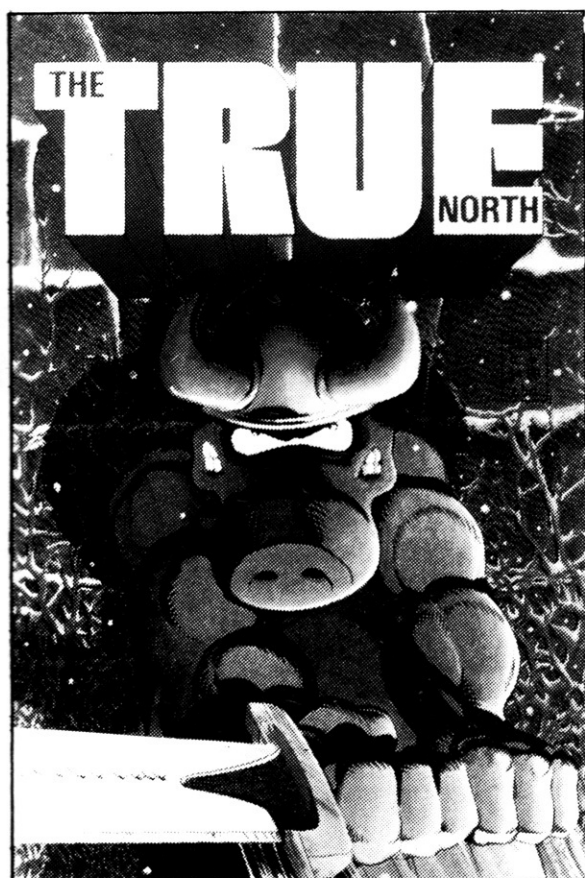

On September 22, 1987, the R.C.M.P. confiscated 192 comic books from **Comic Legends** in Calgary. The owner, the manager and one employee were charged with circulating obscene materials, for which the maximum penalty is two years in jail and \$2,000 in fines. The message is clear: The right of Canadians to read what they want to read is threatened. The right of retailers to sell material intended for adults to adults is threatened. In Canada, freedom of speech is being limited under the judgment of an uninformed minority.
