
And now, our first issue awaits... enjoy!!

Well, it's going to be a while before we actually receive any mail, but let's have a quick chat and get to know one another better. Have a Coke and kick up your feet.

You're holding the first issue of a brand new **ZU**. A couple of years ago we did a large sized one shot edition of **ZU** which featured the work of people like Tracy Kazaleh, Tom Staszer, and the late Deal Whitley. At that time, our schedules didn't allow for us doing anything more than a one-shot; anthologies take a forsaken length of time to prepare and make ready. Things have changed a little bit since then, however, and we are now getting underway with a new, slimmer, meaner version of **ZU**, and we will be out on a regular bi-monthly schedule. For how long? As long as we can manage.

Now, we've had inquiries about a few of our other books, and why they haven't been seen with any sort of regularity. Let's cover that briefly.

A lot of people have been asking us whatever became of **The Furkindred**. Well, it's still around; my duties as editor took a big chunk of time out of my schedule, and a few projects were interminably delayed. Hopefully, pressures have been eased some

what, so now I can concentrate on pushing ahead with the book. Look for some format changes when it reappears.

Champion of Katara was also delayed for the same reason, but I'm slowly easing back into completing my work on that story.

Some folks have also been wondering about the non-appearance of **Wild Kingdom** these many months. Well, this is one of our more demanding titles; it takes a while to get just the right stories of just the right quality. But I think readers will be happy to know that it will return not once, not twice, but a total of four times this year, so you'll get more than your share of sexy furries in 1995.

We've been making a great effort in recent months to get our books on a regular schedule of sorts. While we may have appeared fairly quiescent over the past few months, the truth is that we've been laboring to prepare a few new titles for the new year. Some are old favorites, some are new ongoing titles, and a few are collections and mini-series. But the reason for the long pause... and, for that matter, the long pause between issues of certain titles... is that we spend a lot of time and effort insuring the quality of the material we produce. Whether it's an adven-

ture book, a romance, a super-hero epic, an alternative comic, or just a romp, we want it to be the very best that it could possibly be.

Sometimes, the search for that quality can cause us to reject many stories, or to delay publication until problems can be ironed out. Sometimes we need to wait for the right talents to become available, not wanting to settle for what we consider to be second-best. Sometimes a book has to be seriously re-worked right from the beginning.

Of course, being an independent, sometimes our books suffer from low capital, and some of our creators have to work elsewhere to pick up the slack, and this causes them to push their MU work to the back burner for the duration. And, unfortunately, until they finish their work, we can't print the book.

You may notice that we don't print a large repertoire of titles, like most of our competitors. We prefer, at least for the present, to concentrate upon a small number of releases each month. This enables us to give each title the most complete attention that we can give to it, helping us to achieve a level of quality that we as publishers can be proud of, and that you as readers can be appreciative of.

At the moment, we've only a few books coming out on a regular schedule: ZU, Rhudiprrt, Wild Kingdom; soon to join the line-up will be Fangs of K'aath. Rhudi, however, is probably the most irregular of our regulars, and will be seen only on an issue-by-issue basis. And Mad Raccoons, which is

a summer annual.

The Furkindred will no longer be a regular book, but a regular series of mini-series. The next one to appear will be the five-issue Ferret's Wheel. And there is one Furkindred Special being worked on as well.


We have four mini-series in various stages of completion: **Scareycat** and **Mousekanaut**, **Corus**, **Cyberkitties**, and a **Felicia** mini.

Collections, at the moment, include **Felicia: Melari's Wish** (out now), **Hugo!** (next month!), and a possible **Mad Raccoons** collection.

And what's upcoming in **ZU**? Next issue begins a three-issue run by Croatian artist, Darko Macan, featuring his mercenary bear, Sergei; following that will be a serial by Adrian Kleinbergen concerning furry/racial inequality and airplanes. There will be stories and short pieces by talents such as Roy Pounds, Kjartan Arnorsson, Marc Schirmeister, Will Fortier, Eric Elliott, Mike McMurry, Paul Kidd, and Terry Loh.




